How to use a camera to take a series of photographs. Select and edit digital images	Taking photos, selecting and editing They will use a DSLR camera to take photographs. They will use studio lighting to control contrast. They will review and select images from contact sheets. They will use photoshop to edit and posterise their image.	Photo analysis sheet
Gain a working knowledge of Art from the Impressionist and Fauvist period	Critical Analysis They will research the colour paintings from the Fauvist period and make links to the expression of mood and emotion through colour combinations	Artist research sheet
How to make a mono print	Drawing in print They will make a mono print using carbon paper and a range of linear mark making, including hatching, to add tone and fine detail. This involves the application of skills learned from the DaVinci skull drawing.	A series of mono prints in a range of scale
How to use acrylic paint to make a colour portrait	Colour Painting They will use acrylic paint to apply flat and graduated colour mixing. They will apply an expressive colour scheme.	An expressive colour self portrait
