RE: COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) – UPDATED INFORMATION AND ADVICE FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

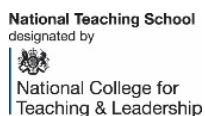
I hope you are well. Following on from my letter last Friday, I am writing to update you with respect to our ongoing plans to manage this rapidly changing situation.

Partial Closure of College & Exams

As you will be aware, the Prime Minister announced yesterday evening that all schools in England should once again close to all, except for vulnerable students or children of key workers, until at least February half-term. We were already prepared to welcome students from these two categories into College today, and to provide remote learning for everyone else. What we weren't prepared for, however, was how long this partial closure of College was to go on for. Neither were we prepared for the announcement about exams – *that 'it is not possible or fair for all exams to go ahead this summer as normal'*, and that Education Secretary Gavin Williamson will work with regulator Ofqual to put in place *'alternative arrangements'*. Whilst we await further information about what these alternative arrangements will be, the DfE has confirmed that the **BTEC and Vocational exams, due to be sat this week and next, will still go ahead**. In the meantime, I would like to assure our Year 11 & 13 students that we will do everything we can to ensure that their hard work and efforts are recognised and rewarded. My message to them is to stay positive, and to continue to engage with their online learning. The Year 11 Mock exams that were due to take place next week have been postponed, and when we receive more information from the DfE and Ofqual, we will make a decision about any future assessments.

Remote Learning

For those students who are working from home, they should continue to follow their normal College timetable for remote learning. Links for Microsoft Teams lessons will be emailed to students' College email addresses, and posted on Show My Homework. For any student who is still unsure about how to access their College email address or Microsoft Teams, there will be a Loom presentation posted on the Show My Homework and the College website by tomorrow morning. If a lesson is unable to be live-streamed, for whatever reason, alternative work will be posted on Show My Homework. Work will continue to be set for ADT, PE, and Performing Arts at Key Stage 3 (Years 7-9), but because of the difficulties involved in delivering such practical subjects remotely, these particular lessons will not be 'live'. I have had lots of feedback from teachers, today, saying that the engagement of students from across all Year groups, in all subjects, has been really good.



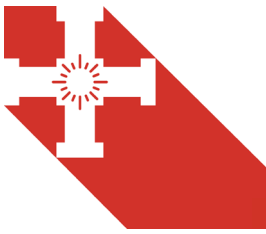

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The vulnerable students and children of critical workers, who are attending College, will also follow their usual timetable, and access their 'live' lessons through College computers.

Starting from this Thursday we would like all students to join their Form Tutor, at 8.55 am, for a daily Form meeting. This will give Form Tutors, and Year Learning Leaders, the opportunity to check in with their students, start the day with a prayer, share any notices, and give any support that may be required. The link for these Form meetings will also be emailed to students' College email addresses and put onto Show My Homework.

Attendance to all online lessons, and completion of work, is compulsory, and registers will be taken. If any families are having difficulty accessing work, please contact your child's Form Tutor in the first instance. It is imperative that students behave appropriately during these online lessons; anyone who does not will be removed from the lesson and not allowed to re-join. There will be no 1:1 video lessons, and staff who are teaching an online session where only one student has arrived will end the session. 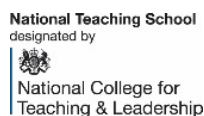
COVID-19 TESTING
