## A Level English Literature transition work

Buy a copy of Wuthering Heights (preferably the Wordsworth classics version) and Othello (preferably the Heineman Advanced Shakespeare version edited by John Seely). Bring it in on the first day!

- To prepare for studying Othello, we want you to research some key contextual information about Elizabethan/Jacobean times: Shakespeare; race/attitudes to race; class; gender; Cyprus; Venice.
- 2. Present your findings in an interesting and creative manner. It must have at least 500 words of key information no cutting and pasting!
- 3. To prepare for studying Wuthering Heights, we want you to research some key contextual information about Victorian Britain and use it to create 3 study resources which should contain a mixture of relevant pictures, facts, quotes (if relevant) and your own notes on your findings.
  - Gender, marriage/divorce and attitudes to sex
  - Attitudes to race and class
  - Religion, death and the afterlife
